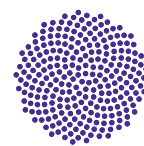

CERTIFICATE OF STUDY IN GLOBAL TRADE COMPLIANCE

This one-year Certificate in Global Trade Compliance was designed to meet the skills gap in the global trade industry and upskill in the practical application of export controls, including understanding trade wars; export registrations and expertise in other markets.

The programme was developed by the Ibec Supply Chain Group in collaboration with the Kemmy Business School and the Faculty of Science and Engineering, University of Limerick and the Irish Medtech Skillnet for employees who aspire to consolidate their existing operational experience and gain a formal global trade qualification.

Working in partnership with Skillnet Ireland and our contracting organisation, the Irish Medtech Association (Ibec sector), the Irish Medtech Skillnet has over the past number of years grown substantially in direct response to the training needs of Industry. PROGRAMME AIMS

This certificate of study is an introduction to global trade compliance. It aims to equip current and aspiring individuals, with the necessary skills, knowledge and competencies to become highly effective in the global trade industry.

Delivery is through weekly online lectures supported by tutor facilitated interactive workshops and additional self-directed online learning by the participant. It will be assessed through continuous assessment. This Certificate of Study in Global Trade Compliance is at NFQ level 6.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Those working in the global trade compliance industry with a minimum of two years industry experience.
- Those seeking a third level qualification in global trade.

CERTIFICATION

Upon accreditation it is proposed that this certificate of study in Global Trade Compliance will lead to an NFQ level 6 award. This will open up a pathway of progression to level 7, 8 and 9 awards.

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LEARNING APPROACH

- A tutor facilitated skills based workshop at which practical exercises and applications reinforce the learning material studied by participants.
- Participants prepare for each module completing private study sessions based upon guided reading, textbooks and self-assessment questions.
- An assignment is completed for each module, with detailed written feedback from tutors.
- Ongoing coaching, advice and support provided for the duration of the programme.
- Be able to interpret regulations for importation into different markets and understand their implications to their business.
- Understand the regulations for each market and be able to generate required documentation to comply.
- Understand how to stay up to date on changes to these regulations.
- Understand the impacts of non-compliance with these regulations.
- Be able to interpret, synthesise and integrate core aspects of exportation and importation associated compliance issues and important processing parameters with a view to problem solving and making regulatory decisions in a timely and competent manner.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Following the completion of the programme, the attendees should:

- Have the tools and knowledge necessary to understand the concepts, approach and constantly changing trade compliance environment.
